Dr. Yvonne Vizina, DKG International Speaker to present at Spring Convention, April 26-28, 2024.

Washington State Organization is excited to announce the Keynote Speaker for the upcoming Spring Convention will be DKG International Speaker Yvonne Vizina, Ph.D. Dr. Vizina is an Assistant Professor in the Faculty of Education at the University of Winnipeg, where she teaches Introduction to Indigenous Education, Indigenous Pedagogies, and Teaching for Sustainability. In her research she investigates traditional indigenous teachings about

human relationships with the earth, including how those relationships affect our personal and collective wellbeing. Dr. Vizina received her Ph.D. from the School of Environment and Sustainability at the University of Saskatchewan where she researched traditional indigenous concepts of sustainability and their applications in post-secondary education programs across Canada. In November 2023, her research was honored by the



Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education. She has written about Métis Traditional Environmental Knowledge and Science Education and is a graduate of the Saskatchewan Urban Native Teacher Education Program, specializing in Biology and Indigenous Studies. Yvonne is a registered member of the Métis Nation, that is recognized within the Constitution Act, 1982 of Canada.

Dr Vizina and learning about her studies. Look for her workshop, *Indigenous Holistic Approaches to Self-Development and Education* on your registration and be sure to see her keynote address, *How can Indigenous Knowledges and Sustainability Education Contribute to the Well-Being of Future Generations?* at the President's Banquet on Saturday.

Legislative Update

The 2024 Washington State Legislative session is on what is known as a short session, which means it is a 60-day session and legislators do not write a full two-year budget. In this whirlwind session, Washington legislators have had over 700 bills to consider. February 21 is the last date for a bill to go from one chamber to the other (where it is assigned to committee). March 1 is the deadline for bills to be brought to the floor of the opposite chamber. The legislature is due to complete its work by March 7, 2024.


There is still time therefore for DKG members to impact legislation that is still "alive" in either the House or the Senate. Members are encouraged to go to leg.wa.gov to follow bills of interest and to contact their representatives or senators regarding desired action.

The legislative priorities identified by WSO DKG chapters in 2022 were: (1) mental health in schools; (2) homelessness for children; (3) educator working conditions; (4) COVID relief; (5) teacher retirement/ COLA Plan 1; and (6) equitable access to broadband. A few of these were addressed by the current short legislative session, but many bills failed to pass out of committee so will need to be reintroduced. Of those still in the process, several relate to DKG priorities.

1. HB 1985 "Providing a benefit increase to certain retirees of the public employees' retirement system plan 1 and the teachers' retirement system plan 1," has passed the House chamber and is now in the Senate Ways and Means

- committee. This bill will provide Plan 1 retirees with a 3% COLA increase up to \$110/month. It needs to pass from the committee to the Senate floor no later than March 1 to be voted on.
- 2. Four other education bills have passed from one chamber to the other. HB 1915 requiring a Financial Education course for graduation is now in the Senate as is HB 1692 requiring student advisory groups for legislative districts. S 6264 passed the Senate and is now in the House and calls for implementation of competency-based education. This one is quite interesting as it substitutes competency for seat-time and is worth following. S 5883 clarifies requirements for "burden of proof" for special education due process hearings.
- 3. Other bills of interest currently on the House floor include HB 1929 which calls for support for young adults who have completed mental health treatment. HB 2331 modifies requirements for district handling of instructional materials challenges. HB 2239 relates to requirements for instruction on social emotional skills.
- Homelessness was an identified issue for DKG members. The only current legislation related is HB 2114 which limits excessive rent increases.

Timelines are short for contacting your representtatives and senators, but they do like to hear from constituents. **Your voice matters!**

Most DKG chapters are struggling with aging membership and filling officer positions. If that describes your chapter, know that you are not alone. But don't wait to develop and implement a plan to correct those issues. Now is the time to act to revitalize your chapter.

DKG membership is special, unlike any other professional organization, because of the fellowship, caring and growth opportunities it affords members and because of the services it provides to members and all educators. It is too valuable to let die on the vine so now is the time to act to revitalize your chapter.

The revitalization process involves several steps:

- Contacting WSO Membership VP Jessica Tufts <u>jessica.tuftsdkgwa@gmail.com</u> or Pat Bennett-Forman, Expansion/Dissolution chair <u>p.bennettformandkgwa@gmail.com</u> to request support inyour revitalization planning.
- Jessica, Pat or one of the WSO Executive Committee members will meet with your chapter board and/or full membership to identify issues, causes and priorities. Because every chapter is unique, we cannot complete these responses for you. Likewise, facilitators do not come with answers or impose actions on

- the chapter because, in order for a plan to work, it must come from the membership. But the facilitator will help your chapter identify its unique plan.
- Once your chapter has established its action plan, tasks and timelines will be determined. WSO Membership Committee members, area liaisons or other state members will assist as appropriate to mentor, collaborate with, and assist in plan implementation.

Does it work? You betcha! Several chapters in our state have gone through this process and are delighted to be welcoming new members. One of those chapters had only five members before the revitalization plan and is up to 14 now and growing. Another reversed a trend of losing 3-4 members per year to now gaining that many or more. One chapter reorganized its leadership team and has an active working board where no one is doing it all.

Determining if your chapter needs intervention is a hard conversation to have. Chapters feel embarrassed to be asking for help. Members are tired. And so on. But, again, you are not alone. And your DKG chapter is definitely worth it! Don't hesitate to begin the process.

Tricia Corsetti is taking two courses at WWU this winter with a goal of achieving a Superintendent credential.


Tricia stated, "All school districts are facing challenging financial times, so I am learning a lot about leadership during a crisis."
